Street Art is unofficial and independent visual art created in public locations for people to see. It can be said that it is a movement, most definitely an art expression, but surely more than this.




# Pink Elephant


# Him and her

In 2008 Morfai illegally added a site-specific artistic detail to the sculpture of Bernardas Bucas, and because of that illegality aspect, the stars were soon painted over. But the artwork that gains meaning after dark was so loved by the locals and visitors that after winning the Kaunas Highlights competition it was revived. The art work can be found in Lithuania, Kaunas K. Donelaičio street 64.



# Cyclist with a rose

Artwork author Tadas Šimkus wanted to bring some romance in the controversial stazione district. The artwork's idea of the rose in the cyclist's hand was mainly inspired by the flower market nearby. The author of the work did not say for whom the cyclist was bringing the rose, he left that part for people's imagination.
